6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

6.3.1 Curriculum Development

As the college follows the syllabus and curriculum of Calcutta University, there is little scope for internal curriculum change. However every department follows an academic calendar.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Teaching and learning process take place through constant interaction between the teachers and students. Debates and Quiz are organised by the teachers to encourage student participation Teachers also use ITC resources.

Teachers engage in research activities and many of their articles are published. The students are also encouraged to engage in research work. The students prepare wall magazines and also write articles for the college magazine and different departmental journals.

The process of implementing digitalisation of the library and cataloguing is in progress.
